## A Word from your Community Lay Director

Greetings Community!

As I sit here writing these thoughts, it is the last day of August. I am contemplating on how quickly the summer has passed, how quickly the year is going by and finally on the realization that my time of service on the board will soon be over. What a time of blessings and of spiritual growth these almost three years have been. My time on the board has been a period of joy because of such wonderful, obedient, serving Christians I have had the privilege to serve with. I want nothing more than for those remaining on the board to have the same feelings when their terms are up. In just a few short months, we will be holding our elections for new members to replace Brenda Utterback, Jill Hannah, Scott Hayes, Rita Steed and myself. There are typically only four spots elected each year, but because of circumstances in a past election, there were five openings when I came on the board and so this year we will elect four persons (top four vote getters) to three year terms and one person (fifth place vote getter) to a two year term. With five people potentially turning over, I thought it important to share some of what I have observed during my three years as a board member that are some characteristics that I think make a good board member. These are just observations from my experience and it is in no way to imply anything about years prior.

What are some characteristics that I have observed from board members that have contributed to almost three years of sometimes difficult, but very productive board activity?

- 1) First and foremost, a good board member is prayerful and discerning of God's will. We cannot forget the Cannon we read so often when we work a walk. This is God's instrument and he uses us to accomplish His will. It can be so easy for us to get in His way.
- 2) Next, I have observed how helpful it has been to have members that are very experienced in all aspects of the weekend. A good mixture of past LD's, Head Cha's, Head Kitchen and Music has been very helpful in the decision making process. We also have a very diverse mixture from an occupation standpoint.
- 3) A Board position is one that does have an element of time commitment to it. A good Board member is one that is committed to and has a schedule that allows them the time to do

their board jobs. Remember the priorities talk; make sure that your schedule will allow the Board position to fall in line with God's will.

- 4) A good Board member also needs to have a collaborative attitude. The ability to process all of the elements of a decision is important. What does not work is a "my way or the highway" attitude. A good question to ask yourself is do I on a regular basis put myself in the other person's shoes and see things from their perspective.
- 5) Lastly, I have observed compassionate Christians that are willing and able to meet difficult issues head on and deal with the one of a kind, one time problems and issues by having a one on one conversation with the Cannon as the core of those conversations. This difficult task is not for everyone, but is necessary when you are dealing with a fallen world.

These are just some of my observations; they are certainly not all inclusive of all of the qualities needed to make a functional Board. The most important exercise needed when submitting your name or nominating a person for election is to pray and feel that God is calling you to guide this beautiful instrument in the El Shaddai Emmaus Community!

**A WORD OF INSPIRATION  
FROM OUR COMMUNITY  
SPIRITUAL DIRECTOR**

The other night was one of those where I could not go to sleep. So, at 2 AM, I crawled out of bed and turned on the TV in the living room. The "Oldie" movie that was just coming on was the 2008 classic, "Get Smart". (Some of us remember the 1960's sitcom by the same name!) In that comedy, the writers gave names to their two opposing spy networks: Control – the good guys, upholding the cause of Freedom; and Kaos – an evil organization committed to world domination.

"Get Smart" pokes fun at all of the spy shows that seem to draw us to the movies, but in naming those two organizations Control and Kaos, the show's writers sum up the very conflict of mankind down thru the ages. You see, the Bible tells us that there are two forces at war in this world. There are the forces of darkness and evil – forces bent upon robbing us of our freedom and creating chaos in our lives. They are forces that the Apostle Paul calls "... the rulers, ... the authorities, ... the powers of this dark world and ... the spiritual forces of evil ..." (Eph. 6:12). And then, by contrast there are the forces of light and freedom – forces controlled by the power and love of God.

Paul then warns us to "put on the full armor of God", so that when the day of evil comes (and it will come), you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything else to stand!" (Eph. 6:13)

But ... there a lot of Christians let their shields down. They get caught up in pride, greed, laziness, envy, bitterness and anger! They expose their weaknesses to the one who is seeking to destroy their relationship with God! They find themselves being angry with their wives/husbands/children. Somebody ticks them off, and they just can't quite think of that person without anger. And that gives an opening to the evil one!

**SPONSORSHIP  
It is a Privilege and an Honor**

As I approach the fall walk, I am excited about once again sponsoring another Christian friend on the Walk to Emmaus. Sharing the joy that I experienced on my own walk over 20 years ago is still one of the rewarding experiences from Walk 15. Let me share with you some tips that have helped me to sponsor successfully.

Pray that God will reveal someone to you that would enjoy the message of the walk weekend. I was walking one morning with a co-worker sharing my love of God with them and explaining a little bit about the Emmaus Walk. She was immediately drawn to my genuine enthusiasm and gratitude how God met me at Clay City that fall weekend. We met soon thereafter, and over lunch, I explained the weekend to her in-depth without going into every detail. I asked her for the name of a best friend and a local family member who I contacted immediately for agape letters. It's good to aim for 10 - 15 letters, notes, emails, or cards. I like to bundle the personal notes in a beautiful ribbon (which is very traditional from the early El Shaddai walks but not necessary). It is simply something that I like to do. My pilgrims always remark how special that extra touch means to them.

Before the walk, I give them a list of things that they may and may not bring to the walk explaining the rationale for each. I make sure they understand the importance of being "unplugged" from all electronics and watches. While many table leaders do that, they always appreciate the thorough list which makes them feel most prepared and less anxious. In the weeks before, I make plans to pick them up (remember, they do not drive themselves!) so we are there at 6:00 – 6:30 p.m. for registration. Please do NOT come earlier as the team is not ready to receive them. I will have a special server who will serve them at the agape dinner as well as either myself or a designated person to pray for them at Thursday's sponsor's hour and Saturday candlelight prayer time.

I make sure that the agape letters are brought down with me on Thursday or Saturday. I often choose to give them a special commemorative agape gift when I take them home after the closing program. There is no room in the small agape sacks for anything but the agape letters and notes so leave it in the car for the ride home.

Please remember to be present at the sponsor's hour on Thursday evening, Saturday agape dinner (if serving) or have someone else there to serve, Saturday evening prayer time, Saturday candlelight, and Sunday closing ceremonies. You will take communion with them at the closing ceremony which is always very special. You will enjoy the ride home sharing all of the great moments of the weekend with them.

At the close of the weekend, your sponsorship role has really just begun as you must accompany your pilgrim to their first gathering. Encourage them in their spiritual growth journey in their Fourth Days and pray, pray, and pray for them. Sponsorship is truly a blessing, but it requires your total commitment of discipleship. The walks depend on strong Christians wanting to reach out to help others in their spiritual growth journey. Are you one of those Christian big brothers or sisters?

Reberger said, "I have a great group to work with and consider all of the adults as the Assistant Community Lay Directors. This group has a lot of experience and has really worked together well." She noted that while they don't have a great deal of needs, there are some areas where they truly appreciate assistance from Emmaus folks. "We covet prayers for the team and caterpillars as the fall teams will begin their team meetings very soon. Secondly, we need Emmaus friends to sponsor teens from age 15 through college years to go on the flights as caterpillars. This is a critical need. Thirdly, we truly appreciate bed and table agape which is often in short supply. And lastly, we count upon our Emmaus friends to attend and show loving support for the teens going through candlelight," commented Reberger.

The flight dates are November 13-15 (Girls Flight) and November 20-22 (Boys Flight) both scheduled at Merom. Candlelight prayer starts at 8:00 p.m. with candlelight at 9:00 p.m. High school students and single college students are welcome to attend. Consider sponsoring a youth in your church or neighborhood.

## HOW EMMAUS CHANGED MY LIFE

Hi, I'm W. Kevin Drane, Clergy, Emmaus Board Representative and Pastor at the United Methodist Temple of Terre Haute. I was raised in southern Johnson County. I graduated from Indian Creek High School in Trafalgar, Indiana. I was heavily involved in F.F.A. and was elected State President after my freshman year at Purdue. A year later I was elected a National F.F.A. Officer. I graduated from Purdue University with a Bachelor of Science in Agriculture specializing in Ag. Economics. I spent the next 23 years working in the agricultural chemical, seed and biotech business holding various sales positions in Ohio, Indiana and Iowa with Monsanto and Imperial Chemical Industries (I.C.I. Americas – known now as Syngenta).

My wife, Marlene (Clevenger) Drane, was raised in Arlington, Ohio (near Findlay) the sixth of eight children. We met in London, England. We have been married 22 years. We have five children (ages 36, 35, 32, 31 and 28) and four grandchildren (ages 8, 6 and 6 and one recent June arrival). Our children live in five different states; Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Nebraska and Wisconsin.

In 2003, after we attended the Walk to Emmaus (Northern Indiana Emmaus Community – [www.neimmaus.com](http://www.neimmaus.com)), our lives were forever changed. During “the Walk” (after candlelight – to be exact), I re-dedicated my life to the Lord. Thanks be to God for his merciful grace for a sinner like me!!! Within a few months I felt a call to pastoral ministry, so I enrolled in Asbury Theological Seminary. Our first appointment was at the Clymers UMC, where after about nine months I realized I couldn't continue to be a full time student, part time pastor and work in the agricultural business any longer ... so I quit my job and focused on school and ministry. Our next appointment was at the Royal Center UMC. I was ordained an Elder in Full Connection in the United Methodist Church in 2011. I was appointed to be with the fine folks at United Methodist Temple, in Terre Haute; in February 2014.

I think we often forget that life needs endings. We need endings so we can have new beginnings ... the Walk to Emmaus helped us clarify that we needed to end my sales career and begin a new thing; ministry within the United Methodist Church. It doesn't happen that way often but that is how it worked for Marlene and me. It has been a bumpy, wonderful, sometimes tenuous, spirit-filled, frustrating life... (I could keep going – but I think you catch where I'm headed). It's been life on the mountaintop and life in the valley and every wonderful place in between! God can use virtually anything to woo us toward a relationship with Jesus. I was blessed that the Walk to Emmaus was a tool that God used to woo our family into a relationship with our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

We enjoy being in ministry. We love people and have hearts for sharing the gospel and doing hands-on ministry within the community. We have both been previously active in Kairos prison ministries. Want to hang out together? We enjoy socializing while playing cards, games or hanging out by a fire. We like to “unwind” by doing some sightseeing from our Harley-Davidson. We call it motorcycle therapy ... but let's face it the best ... by far ... is being with the Body of Christ and worshipping THE One True God!!!

## A Message from the Registrars

Our registrars work diligently to review applications and mail out timely notices. Good sponsorship includes reviewing and making sure that your pilgrim and sponsor applications are complete. They have provided a few suggestions to help us help them.

1. Applications can only be processed if both the front and back page are completed and the \$35.00 deposit included. (There have been instances where shirt size, sponsors walk number and community (if not El Shaddai), and male or female information have been omitted. Please – leave no blank unfilled.
2. Please use only blue or black ink.
3. Please advise if the pilgrim has dietary or special needs in order for the team to be prepared to address the pilgrim's needs.
4. Please print legibly so all letters and numbers are clear, a misinterpreted house number delays the application from being delivered in a timely manner.
5. Always include your walk number next to your name.
6. When you receive your sponsor letter, your pilgrim should have their letter. Please contact them to verify and answer any questions they may have. If you are unsure of the answer to their questions please contact Nancy or Sue.
7. Verify that they have returned their card and if not encourage them to do so.
