Greetings Emmaus Community!

Does anybody else relate to the disciple Peter like I do? I want to challenge our community to read the following passage and respond as you see God leading you, hopefully in total alignment with His will for your life and ultimately in a way that is giving glory to God.

Take a moment now to read Luke 5:1-11. A familiar passage to you I am sure.

I want you (as Gary Scroggins would say) to ponder a few things about this passage. First notice how Peter is obedient when Christ asks him to put out into the shallow water; and are we not all comfortable in the shallow waters. Ways of service where there is no doubt, no un-comfortableness, our routine acts of service.

Now take note of the contrast to Peter's response to Christ when he is asked to put out to the deeper waters. Peter's confidence in himself takes over as he argues with Christ based on his own knowledge and experience. "Master, we have worked hard all night and haven't caught anything." How might this relate to our experience with Christ when he asks us to move out of the comfort of the shallow waters and into the deeper waters where we can't touch bottom anymore.

How often has our first response to Christ been arguments based on our own knowledge and experience? What has our reluctance been to push out into the deeper waters?

My prayer would be that we would eventually respond as Peter did with obedience. "But because you say so" is how Peter ultimately responded to Jesus' request to move out to deeper waters and do your "normal" task a little different.

Friends, I would like you to consider coming along side our friends in the Chrysalis and Kairos communities and push yourself into the deeper waters and possibly consider working a flight or Kairos weekend, attend more candle lights for both Emmaus and Chrysalis or baking some cookies for the Kairos weekends. I believe that Christ is calling our community into a spirit of unity and support on all levels, but that will take some of us answering "But because you say so" to what Christ may be calling you to do. What wonderful blessings could be lying ahead of us if we just respond.

Greetings from the Chrysalis community!

The Chrysalis Community has been working hard at forming our teams for the fall flights. The dates for the girl's flight are November 8—10 and the boy's flight is November 15-17. The Lay Directors for the flights are Becky Loudermilk and Kent Bass. As always, all prayers and Agape are welcome! Keep them coming!

Chrysalis is also in the process of restructuring the committee. Standards and guidelines for committee members have been written and are listed below. If you are interested in serving on the Chrysalis committee and helping to develop the spiritual lives of our young people, please reach out to the Chrysalis committee and submit your name for consideration.

Chrysalis committee Restructure/elections guidelines:

- 1) Anyone who has worked a Chrysalis flight will be eligible for the election and the only ones eligible to vote.
- 2) Even persons that served on this last "board" will be eligible since this is going to be an election process.
- 3) The makeup of the committee will consist of 3 classes and each class will consist of 3 lay people and 1 clergy.
- 4) Each class will have one adult (age 21 or greater), one student/youth (age 16-20), and one at large elected by the next highest vote getter after the adult and youth/student. This can be either a youth or adult member each year.
- 5) The initial election will fill the positions as follows: The top 3 vote getters as described above will fill the 3-year terms. Those names will be marked off the list and we will then follow the process again with the remaining names on the list. The top adult, top youth/student and the next remaining highest vote getter will fill the two-year term positions. Those 3 names will be marked off the list and then we will follow the process again to come up with the one-year term members.
- 6) The top 3 clergy vote getters will be assigned terms the same way, top vote getter 3 years, second highest 2 years and third highest the one-year term.
- 7) The Community SD for the committee will be elected by the clergy elected.
- 8) the Community LD will be elected by the newly elected committee as well as the positions of Assistant CLD, Secretary and Treasurer (Treasurer most likely will be a temporary position until such time as we adopt the governance board structure at which time the governance board will take over the finances of both committees).

ARE YOU PREPARED FOR 2020?

Following the fall walks taking place in just a few weeks it will be time to turn our thoughts to the Walks of 2020. We begin to pray now for the board as they seek God's guidance in selecting the Lay Directors and teams.

Traditionally teams are formed one-third experienced, one-third somewhat experienced and one-third new members. It is very important for those who would like to serve to submit their applications as soon as possible - now is not a bit too soon!

The Men's Spring Walk #196 will take place April 23rd - 26th and the Women's Spring Walk #197 the following weekend on April 30th to May 3rd. Both Walks will be held at Clay City and Lay Directors will be announced at future gatherings.

As we complete our applications and begin to pray for the future teams and their formation and before we agree to serve; we should always consider two very important questions.

Are we able to meet the financial responsibilities of serving on a team without straining our home budget and are we able to commit to giving 100% of our time and attention to the pilgrims and our duties during the weekend?

If we can honestly answer "yes" to those two questions - great. But, if not then we know that as hard as it is to say "no, not this time", in our heart of hearts we also know that it is the right thing to do.

God's perfect will and timing always bring together the exact pilgrims and the team to meet their needs resulting in a beautiful, amazing creation we know as The Walk to Emmaus.

Sponsorship Responsibilities—Are you prepared?

Sponsorship is one of the greatest gifts we can give another Christian. If you think all of the churches have been tapped in the Wabash Valley, think again! There are several churches that could truly benefit from the Walk to Emmaus to help in discipleship growth. I urge you to seek God and have Him direct you to someone that you could invite to go on this transforming weekend.

Here are some tips for new sponsors. The board and registrars remind all sponsors that pilgrim applications cannot be processed unless the down payment of \$35 accompanies the application. Once the pilgrim and the sponsors receive their letters from the registrars, please contact your pilgrim immediately to let them know that they must mail their confirmation card as soon as possible.

Next the sponsor needs to start early gathering agape notes and cards from the pilgrim's family and friends. It's good to aim for 10-15 letters, notes, emails, or cards. I usually set deadlines a couple weeks ahead of the walk weekend for folks to turn in their letters to me emphasizing this is a special surprise for the pilgrim at the end of the walk.

Before the walk, I meet with my pilgrim usually over dinner and give them a list of things that they may and may not bring to the walk explaining the rationale for each. I make sure they understand of being "unplugged" from all electronics and watches. While many table leaders do that, they always appreciate the thorough list which makes them feel most prepared and less anxious.

In the weeks before, I make plans to pick them up (remember, they do not drive themselves!) so we are there at 6:00-6:30 PM for registration. Please do NOT come earlier as the team is not ready to receive them. I will have a special server (opposite genders serve the pilgrims) who will serve them at the Saturday agape dinner, and I will or have a designated person to pray for them at Thursday's sponsors' hour and Saturday candlelight prayer time. The server must arrive by 3:50 PM on Saturday and listen carefully to all directions. If you are able to come by 2:00 pm or so, our agape dinner coordinators are grateful for extra pairs of hands.

The sponsor must make sure that the agape letters are brought down to the campground on Thursday or Saturday. I often choose to give them a special commemorative agape gift when I take them home after the closing program. There is no room in the small agape sacks for anything but the agape letters and notes so leave any gift in the car for the ride home.

Please remember to be present at the sponsors' hour on Thursday evening (right after send-off), Saturday agape dinner (if serving or having someone else there to serve by 3:50 PM), Saturday evening prayer time (8 PM), Saturday candlelight (9 PM), and Sunday closing ceremonies (no later than 4 PM). You will take communion with them at the closing ceremony which is always very special. You will enjoy the ride home sharing all of the great moments of the weekend with them. Remember, gifts larger than an envelope may NOT go in the agape sack. Save it for the drive home. Check in with the pilgrim's family if they have needs while their loved one is away.

At the close of the weekend, your sponsorship role has really just begun as you must accompany your pilgrim to their first gathering. The reunion group gathering starts at 6:00, and it is a very special time. Encourage them in their spiritual growth journey in their Fourth Days and pray, pray, and pray for them. Sponsorship is truly a blessing, but it requires your total commitment of discipleship.

A Word About REGISTRATION

Our registrars work diligently to review applications and mail out timely notices. Good sponsorship includes reviewing and making sure that your pilgrim and sponsor application is complete prior to submission. An incomplete application will delay processing. Please review the following before mailing.

1. Applications are priority dated when received and can only be processed when submitted with the \$35.00 deposit **and** both the front and back page are complete. There have been instances where shirt size, sponsors walk number and community (if not El Shaddai), and male or female information have been omitted. Please – leave no blank unfilled.
2. Please use only blue or black ink, printing legibly so all letters and numbers are clear.
3. Please advise if your pilgrim has dietary or special needs. This enables the team to be prepared to address those needs.
4. Always include your Emmaus walk number and Community next to your name on the sponsor's portion of the application.
5. Pilgrim and Sponsor letters are mailed approximately six weeks prior to the walk. Your pilgrim should receive their letter at the same time as you. Please contact them to verify that they are planning to attend, remind them to mail in their confirmation card and answer any questions they may have.
6. If they are not able to attend, please let one of us know **immediately** in order to have a full walk.
7. If you have any questions, please contact one of us.
