James 3:1-12

James Hewett said, "It isn't the things that go in one ear and out the other that hurt as much as the things that go in one ear, get all mixed up, and then slip out the mouth." Our words can hurt or heal, build up or tear down, bring wisdom or wounds, encourage, or discourage, praise or rebuke, teach or lead astray. The Bible says that little thing, the tongue, is a dangerous weapon.

Why is it so deadly? Someone said words are like nitroglycerine — they can blow up bridges or heal hearts. How true is that?

David shares, "Set a guard, O Lord, over my mouth; keep watch over the door of my lips! Do not let my heart incline to any evil, to busy myself with wicked deeds." - Psalm 141: 3-4.

Set a guard over my mouth? Ever thought about that one? In Matthew 12: 36, Christ instructs, "I tell you, on the day of judgment people will give account for every careless word they speak, for by your words you will be justified, and by your words you will be condemned."

Think of the times you have misspoken, blamed someone for something they did not do, raised your voice when you did not need to, sent a nasty email or text, used sarcasm to beat someone down, talked about someone when they could not defend themselves. We do it well.

Is your tongue like that? Do you have control over it? Sometimes we start a conversation that was to be Christ centered, yet it turned into a gossip-fest. It happens before, during and after church. It happens in school and at work, and at home. But it is so hard to resist.

James warns, "With it (our tongue) we bless our Lord and Father, and with it we curse people who are made in the likeness of God. From the same mouth come blessing and cursing. My brothers, these things ought not to be so."

For all of us, our words carry a lot of weight. I really want you to consider how you can bless someone this week. Can you help someone to feel affirmed? Do you have a tough time saying, "I love you!"?

When someone says it to you, do you clam up? I get it. Been there. But how can you affirm that person by letting them know you love them with your words?

Actions are super important, and the actions must back up the words, but sometimes, kids and adults long to hear those words . . . "I LOVE YOU!" I deeply and passionately love you. Hey, my friend, I love you."

We throw the word "love" around frequently when it comes to fun things and food, but then we hold it back when it comes to those closest to us, those who need to hear it the most. Let them know they are loved.

President Calvin Coolidge said, "I have never been hurt by anything I did not say." I would add—Who might be hurt by what we do not say?

Emmaus Walk Scheduling

From time to time, the community will have a question for the Emmaus Committee about walks. Here's one that was asked recently: Why do you schedule every other year with either a winter or a spring walk?

Answer: We try to give everyone an opportunity to attend and work a walk. Some careers or schedules do not afford time away during warm weather such as farming, construction and other outdoor work. The decision was made many years ago to always have a fall walk and alternate with the spring or winter walk which are so close to each other on the calendar. We used to have three sets of walks each year, but it became too hard to have enough pilgrims or team members for both a winter and a spring walk that happened within weeks of each other. It would be too hard to have the winter walk earlier as the holidays would interrupt team meetings. The decision was made to have winter walks at the end of February and spring walks at the end of April and first of May. We will have winter walks and fall walks in 2024 and spring walks and fall walks in 2025. Hopefully this helps to understand and to pray for opportunities to sponsor or serve.
