Where were you when JFK was shot?

Most of us who were alive then can remember exactly where we were when we heard the news that President Kennedy had been shot. I was in the hallway between the kindergarten and first grade classrooms at St. Patrick's grade school in a tiny little town in upstate New York! I can still recall the despair in the faces of the weeping nuns and other adults in my view.

I was in the upstairs guest room of our friend's house in East Lansing, Michigan when they came up to tell us that Princess Di had been killed in a tragic car accident.

Most importantly, I remember when I truly felt the Holy Spirit for the first time!

My new best friend David Lloyd, and I were getting to know each other on the way down to the dining hall that first night, we discovered that we had a mutual friend, Kevin McCrea. I was thrilled to find out that Kevin was going to be on the music team and I began to breathe a little easier knowing that one of my dear friends was going to be there will me all weekend.

I will always remember my dying moments experience. I tore off a big hunk of bread and chucked it in the basket with great determination...I also had a lot of junk in my past to get rid of! I knelt at the foot of the cross, closed my eyes and began to weep. I recall the pain I felt as I asked for forgiveness from all of the people I had hurt during my life, and for all of the mistakes I had made. All of a sudden I felt a hand rest on my shoulder and I knew that my friend Kevin had come to comfort me in my time of need. Then images of people began to appear in the distance of my closed eyes. Some of whom were people I had asked for forgiveness. Others were the images of friends and relatives who are still here among us and some, like my Mom who had gone home to be with the Lord. As the images became clearer I could see they were all smiling, nodding, giving me the thumbs up to let me know that I had been forgiven and everything was going to be okay! Perhaps they were my "Great Cloud of Witnesses" comforting me, as described in Hebrews Chap. 12 Vs. 1. My tears of sorrow had turned into a steady stream of emotion. As I wiped the tears from my eyes, I could still feel the comforting hand on my shoulder so I reached for my friend...but no one was there! Kevin was still on the other side of the Tabernacle with the music team! I realized at that very moment in my life that I had been touched by God the Father, Christ Himself, and most importantly the Holy Spirit had descended upon me, healed me, lit a fire inside me and I knew that my life would never be the same. The Emmaus experience changes lives and that is why I still cannot wipe that goofy spirit-filled smile from my face! I love sharing it with everyone that God places in my path.

I Need My Reunion Group!

My dear friend and Emmaus brother Nick Schneider recently wrote in his daily blog about the need for Revival. “Standard church revivals generally feature an out of town minister who comes in for about five days and offers nightly special services aimed at getting the congregations ‘fired up’ about Jesus. You know, I’ve written about revival before and studied it and have come to the conclusion that as Christians we probably need revival more than once or twice a year.

Personally, I belong to a small group that meets every Wednesday night. It doesn’t replace my church, it enhances me as a church member. It’s my revival time.

The small group allows us the time to talk about ‘joys and concerns’ or ‘praises and prayer needs’ as some would call it. We pray and we have time for praise and worship. Of course we eat well to start off the meetings following the old adage, ‘feed them and they will come’.

It’s a time of fellowship and getting to know each member of our group better – develop a relationship that is greater than just seeing each other for 90 minutes every Sunday morning at our church.

For me small group provides me a mid-week revival of my spirit and charges my spiritual battery, so to speak. It’s a personal revival each week that I look forward to and feel a void when it is not attended. According to Merriam-Webster Computer Dictionary, revival simply means “a state of being revived, a renewed interest or attention to something, or restoration of force, validity or effect.” That sounds pretty much like what our small group is all about. It’s a time of revival.

Psalm 85:6-9 (NIV) talks about revival. It reads: “Will you not revive us again, that your people may rejoice in you? Show us your unfailing love, Lord, and grant us your salvation. I will listen to what God the Lord says; he promises peace to his people, his faithful servants – but let them not turn to folly. Surely his salvation is near those who fear him, that his glory may dwell in our land.”

Revival is a time of cleansing, awakening, repentance, commitment, personal searching and joy. That’s exactly what participation in a small group can do. We should be glad and thankful that God revives us, charges us, inspires us.

Revival is about prayer and having a burden for the lost, the prodigals who have drifted away and the church washing itself in a bath of praise and worship.

In a true revival, we are taught of the Word of God and are instructed how to live our lives better for God. We are brought under conviction.

We get good instruction about revival in 2 Chronicles 7:14-15 (Amplified Bible), which reads: “If my people, who are called by my name, shall humble themselves, pray, seek, crave, and require of necessity My face and turn from their wicked ways, then will I hear from heaven, forgive their sin, and heal their land. Now my eyes will be open and my ears attentive to prayers offered in this place.”

In our revival small groups, we have our faith renewed and become more equipped to serve our communities in the works of God – saving souls, feeding the hungry, clothing those in need as well as giving hope to the hopeless. I meet with my “Courageous Men” every Saturday morning at 6:30 at Denny’s on the South side of Terre Haute. This group was formed from mostly Emmaus men after the movie “Courageous” came out. After we completed the bible study for Courageous Men, we held a ceremony at our church and pledged to God and our families that we would be the best husbands and fathers we could be. This reunion group has been my revival every week. I know that if I have to miss my time each with these amazing men that my week just does not feel right! We are accountable for each other. We lift up and encourage each other. We also try to help out others in our church, communities and neighborhoods as often as we can. While the members and the studies have changed over the years, the direction has always been the same, to help us make it through another week as we try to walk in the image of Christ as an example for our wives and children. I need my reunion group!

If you need a little revival too, try a reunion group! There are many established groups that meet regularly that are always looking for new members! If you would like to join a group let me know and I will try to match you up! If you would like to join a group let me know and we will get you started. There are a few men in the West Terre Haute and Paris area that would like to get a group started. There is an Emmaus sister from Robinson, Illinois area that would like to get a group together.
