### Renew our commitment!

Please read Acts 2: 1-13 (NRSV) The Coming of the Holy Spirit

In our passage, we are told the church in Jerusalem was "all together". The emphasis is not only on the fact they were in a particular place, but that they met with a particular purpose. The description here is not just one that speaks of their physical location, but also of their spiritual condition. There was, in the fellowship of the early church, a oneness, an accord. What if we were of one accord? What if we felt a "oneness" with each other?

The secret to their oneness was that they shared common commitments - commitments which every committed Christian will share with others who are truly committed to follow Christ.

A committed Christian advocates for unity through encouraging:

1. A common commitment to the Lordship of Christ.

The Bible tells us there were 120 who waited in Jerusalem for the coming of the Holy Spirit that Jesus had promised (Acts 1:15). For 10 days, they waited for the Spirit's coming and spent time in prayer. Why did they wait for 10 days? Because they were committed to doing what Jesus had asked them to do.

There are those today who, despite having a relationship with Christ, are not fully surrendered to the Lordship of Christ. They may be part of the membership of the church, but they are not part of the fellowship of the church.

You see, the strength of the church's fellowship with one another is directly related to the strength of the church members' commitment to living under the Lordship of Christ. When God's people are each focused on the Lordship of Christ, their focus is on something far more important than the things which, too often, are allowed to divide us.

But he or she also advocates for Christian unity through encouraging:

2. A common commitment to loving one another.

Obviously, what makes the difference in the way people treat each other in the intensive care waiting room is the fact that everyone realizes that they are all in the same boat. Likewise, just as the early disciples knew that they were equally in need of the power of the Holy Spirit in order to fulfill what Christ had called them to, we also need to realize that we are all in the same boat.

Without the Lord, we not only can do nothing, we are nothing. We are all sinner saved by God's grace. Such a humble awareness, will make a powerful and positive difference in how we view each other and on our willingness to love and forgive each other.

And we also advocate for Christian unity through encouraging:

3. A common commitment to reaching the lost.

"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you. And you will be my witnesses, telling people about me everywhere - in Jerusalem, throughout Judea, in Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." - Acts 1:8 (NLT)

They prayed, and they planned (Acts 1:15-26). They were consumed with the idea that theirs' was the responsibility to reach a lost world with the Good News about Jesus. They were unified in their mission to share the Gospel with a hurting and hell-bound world.

Likewise, a committed Christian realizes what matters most in church is not what he prefers or she wants, but what will enable us to best get the Good News out to a hurting and hell-bound world. Resolving to reach the lost for Christ is a glue that will always bind God's people together, if they share this commitment. The same is true of any church that is not unified around sharing the message of the Good News.

The committed Christian understands this. Therefore, we advocate for Christian unity by being the kind of believer who encourages others to live under Christ's Lordship; to love one another; and to reach out to the lost.
