Greetings Emmaus Community!

The High Cost of Failure:

Let me first say what a privilege and honor it is to serve this community I love and that has changed my life profoundly again as your Community Lay Director. My prayer is that I am one with the Spirit and God's will in leadership.

With that said, I wanted to share with you a message and theme I received in our Sunday worship that has really been on my heart and that I think is so in line with the mission of Emmaus. It comes out of the book entitled "Bringing Columbia Home". This book tells of the human side of the story surrounding that fateful mission and the recovery efforts that ensued.

It conveys the emotional human struggle that persons at NASA and many agencies went thru to determine the root cause of the failure. As almost all Americans remember, the real root cause was a combination of pride and complacency that lead to a false sense infallibility that resulted in the high cost of 7 astronauts lives.

NASA now has a memorial for the 14 astronauts (7 from Challenger and 7 from Columbia) lost in the space shuttle program. Each of the 14 windows are personalized for each astronaut. Each new NASA employee is brought down this memorial to remind them of the high cost of failure! At the end of the hall is this quote from Ronald Regan that reads "The future doesn't belong to the fainthearted, it belongs to the brave"

I just can't help but to see the parallel to the mission we in Emmaus have, to develop disciples that will deliver the Good News of the Gospel to a hurting world and to offer them a means to obtain a closer walk with Jesus. Just like the theme from our worship service, we need to be reminded of the high cost of failure in the mission Jesus gave us which is to deliver the Good News. That it is not for the fainthearted...and that we need to be bold and confident in our bravery in delivering the message...but unlike the NASA employees, we need to make sure that our boldness and confidence is bore out of our oneness with the Holy Spirit inside us and an assurance we are in His will. Are we up for the challenge, I think so, stay brave my brothers and sisters in Christ!

What's your story?

Recently, my son went to the movie "Bohemian Rhapsody" with some friends, and when I picked him up, he could not wait to tell me all about it. On that ride home he took me on a musical trip through rock and roll history with the group "Queen!" He was so excited to share this special moment with me! I could not wait to go see the movie myself!

Aren't we the same way? We can't wait to tell people about a new restaurant, a concert, or a special trip! When was the last time we felt so inspired to tell anyone about the greatest spiritual moments in our lives? Whether we are hoping to bring someone to Christ or encourage them to get closer to Him through a weekend Walk to Emmaus, all it takes is the courage and obedience to just tell your story! Here's one of my favorites to get us started...

I remember it like it was yesterday, Walk #122 at Clay City in the spring of 2006. My new best friend was Dave Lloyd who had graced us with his gift of music that weekend! While we were getting to know each other on the way down to the dining hall that first night, we discovered that we had a mutual friend, Kevin McCrea. I was thrilled to find out that Kevin was going to be on the music team, and I began to breathe a little easier knowing that one of my dear friends was going to be there with me all weekend. It was shortly after lunch on Friday before I realized that I was supposed to be sitting with my table not the music team!

I will always remember my dying moments experience. I tore off a big hunk of bread and chucked it in the basket with great determination! I also had a lot of junk in my past to get rid of! I knelt at the foot of the cross, closed my eyes and began to weep. I recall the pain I felt as I asked for forgiveness from all of the people I had hurt during my life, and for all of the mistakes I had made. All of a sudden, I felt a hand rest on my shoulder, and I knew that my friend Kevin had come to comfort me in my time of need.

Then images of people began to appear in the distance of my closed eyes. Some of whom were the people I had asked for forgiveness. Others were the images of friends and relatives who are still here among us and some, like my Mom who had gone home to be with the Lord. As the images became clearer, I could see they were all smiling, nodding, giving me the thumbs up to let me know that I had been forgiven and everything was going to be okay! Perhaps they were my "Great cloud of witnesses" comforting me, as described in Hebrews Chapter 12: verse 1.

My tears of sorrow had turned into a steady stream of emotion. As I wiped the tears from my eyes, I could still feel the comforting hand on my shoulder, so I reached for my friend, but no one was there! Kevin was still on the other side of the Tabernacle with the music team! I realized at that very moment in my life that I had been touched by God the Father, Christ Himself, and most importantly that the Holy Spirit had descended upon me, healed me, lit a fire inside me and I knew that my life would never be the same.

I have had the opportunity to share that story many times since then and it has always sparked great conversations from some about how they could go on the Walk and caused others to recall their Emmaus experiences with me.

Make a Friend, Be a Friend, Bring a Friend to Christ

Sponsorship is one of the most rewarding things we do in Emmaus. If you think all of the churches have been tapped in the Wabash Valley, think again! There are several churches that could truly benefit from the Walk to Emmaus to help in discipleship growth. I urge you to seek God and have Him direct you to someone that you could invite to go on this transforming weekend.

Pray that God will reveal someone to you that would enjoy the message of the walk weekend. I was working out in the schools one evening and ran into a colleague. We started talking, and I know the Holy Spirit was there with us. She said that she had noticed my consistent spiritual walk over the time she knew me and wanted to know more about my story. I began sharing my love of God with her and explaining a little bit about the Emmaus Walk. She was immediately drawn to my genuine enthusiasm and gratitude how God met me at Clay City that fall weekend. The rest is history and my friend is about to encounter Christ in a new way at the Winter Walk

Here are some tips for new sponsors. Start early and gather agape notes and cards. It's good to aim for 10-15 letters, notes, emails, or cards. I like to bundle the personal notes in a beautiful ribbon (which is very traditional from the early El Shaddai walks but not necessary). It is simply something that I like to do. My pilgrims always remark how special that extra touch means to them.

Before the walk, I give them a list of things that they may and may not bring to the walk explaining the rationale for each. I make sure they understand of being "unplugged" from all electronics and watches. While many table leaders do that, they always appreciate the thorough list which makes them feel most prepared and less anxious.

In the weeks before, I make plans to pick them up (remember, they do not drive themselves!) so we are there at 6:00-6:30 PM for registration. Please do NOT come earlier as the team is not ready to receive them. I will have a special server (opposite genders serve the pilgrims) who will serve them at the Saturday agape dinner, and I will or have a designated person to pray for them at Thursday's sponsors' hour and Saturday candlelight prayer time. This is very important!

I make sure that the agape letters are brought down with me on Thursday or Saturday. I often choose to give them a special commemorative agape gift when I take them home after the closing program. There is no room in the small agape sacks for anything but the agape letters and notes so leave any gift in the car for the ride home.

Please remember to be present at the sponsors' hour on Thursday evening, Saturday agape dinner (if serving or having someone else there to serve), Saturday evening prayer time, Saturday candlelight, and Sunday closing ceremonies. You will take communion with them at the closing ceremony which is always very special. You will enjoy the ride home sharing all of the great moments of the weekend with them. Check in with the pilgrim's family if they have needs while their loved one is away.

At the close of the weekend, your sponsorship role has really just begun as you must accompany your pilgrim to their first gathering. The reunion group gathering starts at 6:00, and it is a very special time. Encourage them in their spiritual growth journey in their Fourth Days and pray, pray, and pray for them. Sponsorship is truly a blessing, but it requires your total commitment of discipleship. The walks depend of strong Christians wanting to reach out to help others in their spiritual growth journey. Are you one of those Christian big brothers or sisters?

A Word About REGISTRATION

Our registrars work diligently to review applications and mail out timely notices. Good sponsorship includes reviewing and making sure that your pilgrim and sponsor application is complete prior to submission. An incomplete application will delay processing. Please review the following before mailing.

1. Applications are priority dated when received and can only be processed when submitted with the \$35.00 deposit **and** both the front and back page are complete. There have been instances where shirt size, sponsors walk number and community (if not El Shaddai), and male or female information have been omitted. Please – leave no blank unfilled.
2. Please use only blue or black ink, printing legibly so all letters and numbers are clear.
3. Please advise if your pilgrim has dietary or special needs. This enables the team to be prepared to address those needs.
4. Always include your Emmaus walk number and Community next to your name on the sponsor's portion of the application.
5. Pilgrim and Sponsor letters are mailed approximately six weeks prior to the walk. Your pilgrim should receive their letter at the same time as you. Please contact them to verify that they are planning to attend, remind them to mail in their confirmation card and answer any questions they may have.
6. If they are not able to attend, please let one of us know **immediately** in order to have a full walk.
7. If you have any questions, please contact one of us.
